- Huge thank you to all of our Division Managers and Team Officials.
- RMMHA held 4 tournaments, a grad game, scholarship games, award ceremony
- Continue to see too much time spent collecting registration, 'A' player fees, and late fees that were outstanding and we continue to put measures in place to lessen that time commitment. We did the soft launch of the new policy for repeat collections and going into next year we will be enforcing that policy as it is written
- Policy Committee continues to work on updating our Policy Manual to ensure current terminology is in place and we have clear and accessible policies
- Ice allocation was very challenging this season!

- 5% increase in the number of athletes from last year to this year means more ice needed which is challenging. Ice continues to be approximately 45% of our Association cost
- Playoff scheduling was a challenge this year with one less week of playoff time scheduled by PCAHA while at the same time increasing the number of playoff games in the shorter time period
- Scheduling of the Winter Round Up tournament in mid February caused some additional playoff scheduling challenges
- Team Managers as a whole very responsive and did a great job of working with Ice Allocator to reschedule conflict games
